IN FOURTEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-TWO...

October brings with it, in addition to Halloween, Columbus Day. Most of us growing up learned the old rhyme: "In fourteen hundred and ninety-two, Columbus sailed the ocean blue." It was an easy way to remember the (supposed) discovery of America by Christopher Columbus. In actuality, Columbus landed in the Bahamas around October 12, 1492 and in 1493 he landed in Hispaniola (present day Dominican Republic). As far as I know, Columbus never actually set foot on mainland USA, so it's probably more accurate to say Columbus came to "the Americas" in 1492. And, here's a little bit of trivia for you (no extra charge): the modern-day federal holiday of Columbus Day is thanks to the lobbying efforts of Mariano Lucca from (drumroll please) – Buffalo, New York! So, from this transplanted Buffalonian, Happy Columbus Day!

While I have always associated Columbus Day with the discovery of the Americas, after a little reading on the subject I came to learn that its origins actually go back to the 1700's. On October 12, 1792, the Columbian Order of New York decided to celebrate their Italian heritage by commemorating Christopher Columbus's discovery of the Americas (he was Italian, you know). Over the years, people in other areas around the country held similar celebrations around October 12th as a way to celebrate their Italian heritage. As Columbus Day began to be celebrated more universally around the country, in the late 1800's the focus included lessons on citizenship, social progress and loyalty to country, which gave rise to the Pledge of Allegiance. While its association with the celebration of Italian heritage has diminished over the years, in 1971, the second Monday in October officially became the present federal holiday of Columbus Day (thanks to Mariano Lucca of Buffalo!). Class dismissed.

I want to take this opportunity to thank Don Amberg for leading the ride to Dogs Inc in August while I was away for my daughter's wedding. Those who attended were introduced to our very own Rook, who made a guest appearance with her trainer. Nominations for Director for 2026 closing soon

As discussed in the September newsletter, nominations for Director for 2026 opened up at the September 5th Chapter Meeting. Nominations will close at the October 3rd Chapter Meeting. If you are interested in the position of Director and have not submitted your name to either Dennis Adams or Dan Balla or Jason Whidden, the General Manager at our sponsoring Dealer – Tampa Bay Harley Davidson, you need to act now. Please review my last article in the September newsletter to see if you qualify for the position.

Once nominations close on October 3rd, the nominees will need to visit with Jason Whidden for approval to be placed on the ballot. For those unfamiliar with how HOG Chapters work, the sponsoring Dealer has final and absolute say on how the OTC HOG Chapter operates. This includes who is Director and whether or not we have an election.

Assuming that all nominees meet with Jason's approval, election of a Director for 2026 will take place at the November 7th Chapter Meeting. If there is only 1 candidate after nominations are closed at the October 3rd Chapter Meeting and with Jason's approval, we can hold the election at the October Chapter Meeting by suspending Section 5 – General Election Voting of the OTC Bylaws. By doing so, it gives the new Director for 2026 an early start on filling the other board positions for 2026.

Drew's Views

The 13 Most Common Causes of Motorcycle Accidents: How to Avoid Them

Short and sweet item this month, but plenty of food for thought.

- 1. **Left-hand turn accidents:** Stay w/in the speed limit. Cover the controls & be prepared to stop at intersections.
- 2. **Unsafe lane changes:** Always signal before switching lanes. Never drive in the middle of two lanes. Check blind spots 1st. Change 1 lane at a time. Never change lanes in/near an intersection.
- 3. **Speeding:** Speed-related motorcycle accidents often end with fatalities.
- 4. **Dooring:** Note if parked vehicles are occupied. Stay away from parked vehicles in general.
- 5. **Head-on collisions:** Stay in correct lane; Maintain safe speed; Be aware of the road situation.
- 6. **Alcohol use or other DUI:** In the U.S., alcoholimpaired drivers cause 29 fatal accidents per day; 1 every 50 minutes. Steer clear of drivers exhibiting suspicious behavior.
- 7. Lane splitting: See dooring.
- 8. Sudden stops by the vehicle you are following: Maintain reasonable speeds and safe distances. Practice the life-saving skill "Quick Stop" often.
- 9. **Inexperienced or novice motorcycle riders:** Must eliminate distractions, remain aware of other vehicles, and practice life-saving skills. Quick stop, swerve. Take the free Tampa PD SMART Course. <u>Tampa SMART Safe Motorcycle and Rider</u> Techniques | City of Tampa



- 10. **Dangerous road conditions:** Slow down on rough roads. Keep a safe distance from vehicles to your front. Stop instead of swerving if possible. Eliminate distractions.
- 11. **Hitting fixed objects:** Be aware of the road situation. Maintain a reasonable speed. Avoid distractions and keep both hands on the handlebars.



- 12. **Running off the road or into oncoming traffic in a curve:** Be at the correct speed and in the correct gear before entering curves. Use the outside-inside-outside method to flatten curves.
- 13. **Motorcycle defects:** The cause of < 5% of accidents & easiest to avoid. Follow the maintenance schedule. Johnny will thank you!



Florida's "Move Over Law" - Motorcycle Safety Tips

In Recent News: A motorcyclist was "ejected" from his bike and propelled into the back of a Road Ranger truck stopped on the side of the highway, and his motorcycle hit the back of an SUV the Road Ranger was assisting. As the investigation is pending, there may be a question of whether another vehicle caused the biker to hit the Road Ranger's stopped vehicle. Tragically, the biker died as a result of the crash and the Road Ranger himself (sitting in the truck) may have catastrophic or life-threatening injuries.

Florida Statute 316.126 (Paraphrased)

If an authorized emergency vehicle, sanitation vehicle, utility service vehicle, wrecker, road, bridge maintenance, construction vehicle, or a disabled vehicle is stopped on the side of the road displaying warning lights or hazard lights ... the driver of every other vehicle, as soon as it is safe shall "vacate" the lane closest to such vehicles when driving on a highway with two or more lanes traveling in the direction of the emergency vehicle.

If such movement cannot be safely accomplished, the driver shall slow to a speed limit 20 mph less than the posted speed limit when the posted speed limit is 25 mph or greater or slow down to five (5) mph when the posted speed limit is 20 mph or less, except when otherwise directed by law enforcement officer. A violation may result in a traffic infraction, punishable as a "moving violation" with related fine and points added to your driver's record.

As a motorcyclist, we must be extra alert, attentive and watchful of our surroundings and must move over (or reduce our speed if we cannot move over). We must also have "situational awareness" as we are extremely "vulnerable" to hazards – sometimes faced with multiple hazards at the same time. This is especially true in rush hour or congested traffic situations. By following the rules, we considerably increase our chances of keeping ourselves and others alive. Additionally, a violation of the law results in a fine and points on your driver's license, which can lead to other consequences.

By having situational awareness and following the "Move Over Law", we significantly reduce risks of being involved in a crash, towards protecting ourselves, our emergency responders and many others.


